

Complementary & Alternative Therapies to Consider

Acupressure/Meridian Therapy – No needles and nonnarcotic

Acupuncture – Can relieve the anxiety, depression and insomnia that often affects TBI patients

Auriculotherapy – Ear acupuncture to relieve pain and stress

Aromatherapy - Use of diffused oils to increase oxygen flow to the brain to promote healing, stress relief and relaxation

Baclofen Pump – Directs medicine to specific areas of the spinal cord to relieve brain injuries

Chiropractic – Restore neurologic function after a specific adjustment or cranial therapy

Color / Light Therapy – Reset and activate stem cells

Cupping - Muscle release

Cranial sacral massage – Use of bodywork to relieve compression in the head, neck and back

Craniosacral Therapy – Cross between chiropractic and osteopathic maneuvers or hands on healing

EFT (Emotional Freedom Technique) – A type of acupressure to help with anxiety, depression, pain, etc.

EMDR (Eye movement desensitization and reprocessing) – A mental health treatment technique for anxiety, PTSD, etc.

Holistic Practices – Nutrition, health education, movement, yoga and gentle exercise

Homeopathy - Provides immune support

Horsemanship (also known as Hippotherapy or Equine Therapy) – Healing through connection with horses and riding therapy

Hyperbaric Chamber Therapy – Breathing pure oxygen in a pressurized environment to treat some medical conditions including TBI

Neurocognitive Services – Help with mental health conditions such as mood disorders and anxiety

Neurofeedback – A type of biofeedback that focuses on neuronal activity of the brain to reinforce desired brain activities

Massage - Pain relief and relaxation

Meditation – Impact the ability to sustain focused attention and improve cognitive efficiency

Music Therapy – Use of music for language building, anxiety, health conditions, dementia

Pelvic Rebalancing – Overall posture and core alignment

Reflexology – Use of foot massage to promote wellness in other areas of the body

Somatic Trauma Therapy – Treatment for PTSD and other mental and emotional health issues through the connection of mind and body

Maria Martinez: Miracle on a Mission

Imagine experiencing more than 10 concussions. Add multiple serious accidents, breast cancer and a stroke. Many people would have given up. Not Maria Martinez. She is a miracle on a mission. Her mission is to find any means she can to support brain injury survivors in Pueblo. Standing up for others is nothing new, she has been doing that since her high school days.

Martinez believes she sustained her first concussion at the age of eight when her motor bike slammed into another bike. In those days, there was not much discussion about concussion or damage to the brain. Looking back, she realizes she had learning deficits in school that were likely the result of this injury.

She also experienced anger issues, felt socially awkward and was aware of cognitive issues. "I was probably depressed and didn't realize it," she said, "I didn't fit in."

Martinez found an outlet in martial arts and boxing and then graduated into extreme sports after college. These activities "continued to contribute to my cognitive concerns," she explained. When she did her student teaching while at the University of Northern Colorado, she realized she still had issues, but she did go on to teach at the high school level. She ultimately left teaching and joined the Department of Corrections in security and as a trainer for electronic devices.

A motorcycle accident in 2007 changed everything. "My anger issues were worse, I had lots of falls and my balance was off," she said. Two years later she was hit by a food truck in a parking lot and struck her head. She was dazed again. "Every time my head was jolted, I had more issues. My cognitive ability to read and understand was very low," she explained.

Martinez said she snapped and got into a fight at work. She was sent to a psychiatrist who felt she needed rehab for her brain injuries. Then in 2010 "I had a stroke, and my visual ability was off. I had seizures after the stroke. I couldn't drive. I went into rehab for a month and came out really struggling with cognitive problems." It was in rehab that Martinez was invited to participate in a support group.

One of the other things she did was retain an attorney who helped her with a Workers' Compensation claim and was able to get her placed on long term disability. "It was the best thing I ever did," she said.

She said she retired after 20 years at the DOC because the warden considered her a high-risk employee as a result of all her injuries and health concerns.

All of her concussions were closed head injuries without loss of consciousness. After the stroke and retirement her focus shifted to recovery.

It was in retirement Martinez says she realized there were not a lot of resources in Pueblo for brain injury survivors. She was depressed, drinking and doing narcotics. There were suicidal close calls. She started going to the YMCA to work out and began travelling to Denver for brain injury support. In 2012 she started leading a brain injury support group at Parkview Hospital. The COVID pandemic derailed that group. A new online group called Brain Chat was formed to provide education and support for survivors of brain injury. It is part of Pueblo Brain Injury LLC and continues to be active. There are additional support groups that focus on art and creative writing.

Pueblo Brain Injury LLC has received two MINDSOURCE Brain Injury Network community grants. These grants enabled Martinez to collaborate with other brain injury professionals throughout the state and she was trained with other brain injury survivors to facilitate a self-advocacy program called Self-Advocacy for Independent Life (SAIL).

A third grant is geared toward Spanish speaking people ages 17 to 24 to help them improve life skills using the SAIL program. Much of her work occurs at the Center Toward Self-Reliance on West 8th Street. She continues to assist with fine tuning the SAIL program with the Brain Injury Alliance of Colorado.

"I started to gain hope from exposure to others who were more severe than me, but still worked and volunteered," she said.

Martinez wishes that everyone would realize "how complex it is to manage your life when you have a brain injury. I wish people would be more compassionate. It is a real concern of mine that the professional services network better understand the problems brain injury patients deal with."

"I look at myself as someone who respects life a lot. I feel I'm a better person because of brain injury. My goal is to see centers like the Center Toward Self-Reliance incorporate brain injury programs in ways other than support groups.

"I am still focusing on my own recovery. I currently participate in speech therapy to focus on cognitive processes, go in for a balance tune up for physical therapy and recently had a ENT evaluation," she said.

Martinez formed a nonprofit at the end of 2021 called Re-Inspired Minds. The focus of the organization is to bridge gaps for community resources and education for brain injury patients.

Her advice to new brain injury patients is "take any avenue you can so you are not stagnated. If you don't like a particular support group, join another one. Reach out! Fight isolation. As part of your recovery, you need to be involved in community. Allow yourself the opportunity to not give up. Ask yourself what you are going to do to be positive."

Martinez lights up when she talks about progress that has been made for brain injury survivors in Pueblo and throughout the state of Colorado.

Long-Term Traumatic Brian Injury Survival

Recovery from traumatic brain injury is not a straight line. Progress ebbs and flows. Patients can show significant improvement initially only to be followed by new concerns that arise months or years later.

Advancements in the treatment of TBI have led to better long term survival rates for patients. This has allowed researchers the ability to conduct long term studies of TBI survivors and document many new challenges they could face. The findings show some long term complications of TBI survival can include regression, as well as later onset of other disabilities including, depression, post-traumatic stress disorder, bi-polar disorder, obsessive compulsive disorder, and most recently identified-Alzheimer's disease and dementia.

It is important for TBI patients and their families to document changes in recovery and relay them to their medical professionals so appropriate follow up care or additional treatment can be considered.

Research completed since the early 2000's has confirmed that symptom improvement in adult TBI patents followed a typical pattern, with the most improvement coming within the first two years post-accident. Thomas Novack, PhD, and Tamers Bushnik, PHD, publishing for the Model System Knowledge Transition Center Handbook, confirm that the most improvement post injury is in the first six months post injury. Improvement continues but at a slower pace for the next six months to two years. Improvement slows substantially after that.

Regression

Long term studies confirm that most long term TBI survivors will eventually experience regression of some sort, an actual backtracking of the gains made immediately post-accident.

Reporting in the Archives of Physical Medicine Rehabilitation, December 2008, Drs Cloella, Verwegen and Green studied the post recovery decline in adults with TBI 5 years post injury. They confirmed a significant decline in verbal fluency and delayed recall. In addition, an article in The Lancet Neurology, Volume 11, No.12, December 2012, authored by Drs Laura Moretti, Irene Chrisofari, and Jordan Grafman, confirms a significant decline in cognitive functioning in older adults with a history of TBI.

In a very interesting study reported in The Journal of Head Trauma Rehabilitation: July/ August 2018, Drs. O'Neil-Pirozzi, Ketchum, Hammond, and others compared a group of individuals who died at more than 1-year post-TBI with a matched group of survivors. The deceased group demonstrated significantly poor global functioning on all physical, cognitive, and psychological functioning variables at their most recent follow up visit prior to death.

Obsessive Compulsive Disorder

In an article for the for the publication Very Well Mind dated June 22, 2017, Owen Kelly, PhD, Dr. reports that while symptoms of obsessivecompulsive disorder can occur immediately after injury, there has been confirmation of TBIinduced OCD months after the initial injury.

Drs Berthier, Kulisevsky, Gironell and Lopez reported in The Journal of Neuropsychiatry, Neuropsychology, and Behavioral Neurology, Vol. 14, No. 1, found that six of the ten patients they studied developed OCD after suffering mild TBI, most of them with no pre-morbid or family history of OCD

Long-Term Cont. Anxiety Disorder, Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, and Depression

Development of anxiety disorder post TBI has also been documented. An article authored by Michelle Albicini and Audrey McKinlay, PhD, Journal of Head Trauma Rehabilitation, May/June 2008, Vol 33, No 3., studied anxiety disorder in adults with childhood traumatic TBI. They studied 95 males and 74 females and found that adult survivors experienced persistent anxiety, panic attacks, specific phobias and depression, some more than 13 years post injury. Another study in the same journal in their January/February 2018 issue, authored by Drs Osborn, Mathias, Fairwether-Schmidt and Anstey, followed groups of young, middle aged, and older adult TBI survivors and confirmed a significant association between sustaining a TBI and developing clinically significant depression.

There also now appears to be a clear link between TBI and post-traumatic stress disorder. In an article published by UCLA Life Scientists in their Science Daily Newsletter, February 15, 2012, they confirm a causal link between TBI and an increase susceptibility to post traumatic stress disorder, as well as anxiety disorder. A similar article published in Frontiers in Neuroscience, 2016 confirmed similar findings.

Alzheimer's Disease and Dementia

A more dramatic development has been research finding showing a link between TBI and the development of Alzheimer's disease and dementia. The previously cited research in the Lancet Neurology study also found a link to these conditions for long term TBI survivors. In a follow up study in The Lancet Psychiatry, April 10, 2018, Drs Fann and Pedersen identified a significant increase in incidents of dementia compared to non-TBI adults the same age. Another study published in The Lancet Psychiatry reported on by U.S. News and World Report studies 2.8 million patient records found a significant risk of dementia and Alzheimer's disease. The study found that a single severe head injury increased the risk for dementia by 35%. People in the study who suffered two or more mild to moderate TBI's had a 33% increase chance. People who suffered four or more TBI's had a 61% increase chance. The conclusion of the study was that people who suffer a TBI in their 20's are 60% more likely to develop dementia or Alzheimer's disease in their 50's.

Case Study- Rocky

I worked with this claimant for over 20 years, and I got to see firsthand some of the challenges he faced through the aging process. Rocky was 19-years-old when he was in a major car accident and almost did not survive. He was in a coma for almost a week and sustained a severe TBI, resulting in cognitive deficits including impaired memory, short attention span, problem solving issues, problems with judgement, difficulty in information processing, anger management and significant motor deficits on his right side for both his arm and leg. Although he was a high school graduate, neuropsychological testing post injury placed him at the grade school level in reading, spelling and math. After a lengthy in-patient stay, he was transferred to a rehabilitation hospital for continued treatment and eventually transferred to a residential community-based facility with significant supervision. Over the first five years post injury Rocky made remarkable progress in all areas, eventually transferring to a residential step program with the goal of independent apartment living with help from community living aides. He became employed in the community and was functioning at a high enough level to maintain a job and arrange for public transportation for work and social events without the assistance of his community care team.

At a team meeting about 15 years post-accident, his community care team reported problems Rocky was starting to have trouble remembering how to arrange for transportation, taking his

medications on time and completing his job duties. A repeat neuropsychological evaluation confirmed that his scores in several domains of cognitive functioning had declined when compared to the previous neuropsychological evaluation five years previously. We eventually needed more community care team hours to give Rocky the extra assistance he now needed to continue living semi-independently.

Rocky also developed OCD about five years post injury, with his parents reporting no pre-injury symptoms. He was especially obsessed with cleanliness and orderliness and joined a supported employment janitorial crew. He was eventually competitively employed as a busser for a local restaurant. When the restaurant closed, he was hired by a local nursing home in the laundry department.

About five years post-injury Rocky also developed a form of seasonal bipolar disorder. Again, his parents said there were no pre-injury issues with this. He was more manic at the start of daylight savings time and into the summer months. He had issues with depression during the fall and winter months. The treatment team adjusted his medication regimen accordingly each season after he was diagnosed.

While it needs to be said that not all TBI survivors experience all or any of these secondary disabilities, close follow up by the treatment team can identify issues at an early stage, making intervention of these challenges more successful.

The Pikes Peak Region offers brain injury patients, their families and caregivers a wide variety of support group options. Some are activity based like art, music or creative writing. Debbie and Rob Carnes facilitate the Headway Neuro / Stroke Support Group in Colorado Springs. The group meets the first and third Wednesday of each month at Fargo's Pizza on East Platte Avenue. The group focuses on activities that stimulate the brain, bingo, karaoke, crafts and fellowship with other traumatic brain injury and stroke survivors. They also have periodic guest speakers. Headway is a group member of the Brain Injury Alliance of Colorado. Family members are welcome to attend.

Debbie said, "The group does a lot of crafts because if you don't use the brain, you lose it." Group members pitch in and help each other if the task is a challenge for some. She and Rob see the group as a second family. The couple works hard to provide a variety of programming for attendees. This includes finding and screening brain injury movies, an outing for ice cream and a Christmas Party at a restaurant. "It's important for survivors to move out of their comfort zone and try different things," she explained.

Rob encourages brain injury survivors to give a support group a try. If the group doesn't meet an individual's needs they don't have to stay.

Debbie has been a support group facilitator for 20 years. She got hooked when she took a client to a support group and saw the magic that happened when people gathered together. A survivor of three brain injuries herself, Debbie can relate to others struggling with brain injuries and help them feel comfortable in the group. She loves to see group members flourish and form friendships.

Rob loves to see people forget about everything for two hours.

Other groups in the region are geared toward supporting military members in the community with brain injuries. There are groups for women. There are speech therapy groups. 



Brain injury resources

What is a brain injury?

Acquired brain injury is an injury to the brain that has occurred after birth and which is not hereditary, congenital, or degenerative. Causes include external forces applied to the head and or neck (traumatic brain injury), anoxic/hypoxic injury (cardiac arrest, carbon monoxide poisoning, airway obstruction, hemorrhage, drowning), intracranial surgery, infectious diseases, seizure disorders, toxic exposure (substance abuse, ingestion of lead, inhalation of volatile agents), aneurysms, and vascular obstruction (stroke).

Brain injury affects the whole person, including changes in the physical, emotional, and cognitive areas of the body. These changes can impact how a person reacts to his or her daily life, including school and work, and how s/he manages his or her finances. Relationships and a person's well-being are determined by how well he or she can manage these challenges. The road can seem long and insurmountable, especially without help.

Stroke Warning Signs And Symptoms

F.A.S.T. is:



Face Drooping — Does one side of the face droop or is it numb? Ask the person to smile.



Arm Weakness — Is one arm weak or numb? Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward?

Speech Difficulty — Is speech slurred, are they unable to speak, or are they hard to understand? Ask the person to repeat a simple sentence, like "the sky is blue." Is the sentence repeated correctly?



Time to Call 911 — If the person shows any of these symptoms, even if the symptoms go away, call 911 and get them to the hospital immediately

Assistive Technology for Traumatic Brain Injuries

Having a Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) can make everyday tasks seem very daunting. Assistive Technology (AT) can ease that fear with simple, easy-to-use devices that can make performing those tasks even easier. People that have a TBI often have difficulty with vision, memory and cognition, mobility, and weakness on one side, among other effects. AT devices can help with all of these functional limitations.

For example, recordable pens or key chains can be used to help with memory problems. For

someone with weakness on one side or other mobility challenges, there are products that help with food preparation, buttoning a shirt, or washing their hair. There are many devices that will help with grip difficulties. Everything from turning a doorknob to holding a utensil can be solved using AT. To help with vision, there are handheld or electronic magnifiers, as well as devices that will read a document out loud. A person with a TBI should consult a professional prior to using Assistive Technology for a specific pairing of a product that will work for their needs. Since TBI's affect each individual person differently, a product that works for one person may not be appropriate for another person. However, once a device is properly selected, it can be absolutely life changing and crucial in helping someone maintain their independence. TBI versus ABI

The medical terms and abbreviations associated with a diagnosis of a brain injury can be very confusing to a patient and the family. A brain injury can be classified in many different ways. Two ways in which a brain injury can be classified is as a traumatic brain injury (TBI) or as an acquired brain injury (ABI). All TBI's are also under the umbrella of an ABI, but not all ABI's are TBI's. Confused yet?

An ABI is defined as an injury to the brain occurring after birth that is not hereditary, congenital, or degenerative. Based on this definition, diagnoses such as cerebral palsy, multiple sclerosis, and Down's syndrome are not included under the category of ABI even though they may have involvement of the brain. Causes of an acquired brain injury do include tumors, blood clots, strokes, seizures, toxic exposures, infections such as meningitis or encephalitis, metabolic disorders from diabetes or liver or kidney diseases, neurotoxic poisoning such as carbon monoxide, and lack of oxygen to the brain from drowning, airway obstruction with choking, or cardiac arrest. As mentioned, a traumatic brain injury is also an ABI.

A traumatic brain injury, as defined by the Brain Injury Association of America, "is an insult to the brain caused by an external physical force that may produce an altered or diminished state of consciousness, which results in an impairment of cognitive abilities and/or physical functioning. It can also result in the disturbance of behavioral or emotional functioning. These impairments may be either temporary or permanent." Causes of a TBI can include: a motor vehicle accident, falls, gunshot wounds, sports injuries, workplace injuries, child abuse such as shaken baby syndrome, domestic violence, and military actions.
