

What AYBOS: Advocacy Services Does

- → Provides **Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) screenings** for incarcerated individuals
- → Supports community Recovery Partners
- → Helps organizations build mental health support systems

The Importance of Safety in Healing



- A sense of safety is a requirement for change/growth
- Individuals with TBI and Trauma are often stuck in a "fight or flight" mindset.
 - Therefore anything can be perceived as a threat and frequently is.

Understanding TBI'S

- Most people are unaware that TBI exists let alone that they suffer from one
- Lived experience is the connection for most
- Those with TBI are in survival mode
- Feeling unsafe increases risk-taking behaviors
- TBIs are often mishandled by the medical health system
- You can't change unless you feel safe

Our Role as Professionals

- Encouraging self-advocacy through peer support
- Remind them that a TBI doesn't define them
- Get to know them outside of their suffering
- Special training to identify TBI behaviors
- Education, tools, and access to treatment

Call to Action

- Healing requires preparation, persistence, and safety
- Hurt people hurt people ; healed people heal people
- Healing is possible, even if not perfect
- Support trauma recovery initiatives
- Promote awareness of TBI's
- Create safer environments for individuals with a TBI



COMMUNITY DEFINED APPROACH

- 62 Participants so far increased engagement with TBI/ Trauma awareness, and wraparound support services.
- 48 of those 62 Participants increased their connections and retention to help and support through screenings.
- 100% of Participants increased skills or awareness for addressing mental health and substance misuse issues through TBI solutions, referrals, and informative
- 27 Participants (now Recovery Partners) increased resilience and ability to cope with challenges by following the ASAP Process.

AYBOS ADVOCACY is a collective of TBI screeners, implementing AYBOS custom ASAP process, coupled with refferal/ wraparound services with the Road Called STRATE (TRCS) to first bring an individual and then their life to a "Baseline State of Safety". Together, AYBOS/RCS continue to increased engagement and retention in supports, through screenings, treatment, while reducing stigma with the rebuildvourmind.org (RYM) awareness initiative on TBIs and trauma impacts in our homes, neighborhoods, and cities alike.

Through the Caring for Denver ATJ Grant, RYM has developed a Behavioral Health System prioritized by results, and reinforced by the traction of the Rebuild Your Mind Initiative.

AYBOS is a Denver, Colorado based minority/ micro business with a focus on superior business development in underresourced communities since being founded in 2008.

- 48 Participants that haven't been traditionally
- These same 48 Participants have increased trust, comfort, and direct access to care through Rebuild Your Mind.
- Only 3 of 48 (6.2%) Participants have shown no TBI
- 100% of our TREATMENT PROVIDERS (Collective Therapy Pool) were able to stay more engaged in their role and/or feel valued and supported.



CARE OVER TIME Consistent, flexible Care options Throughout the Healing ourney.

- 62 Participants experienced increased options to TBI/ trauma education, treatment, and acute care needs
- We have guided 28 individuals through the ASAP process, and have sent 26 individuals to treatment through our Collective Therapy Pool.
- 17 Participants have experienced improved coordination of their care, through continued treatment with our **Collective Therapy Pool and Peer Supporters**
- 48 Participants engaged in screenings, including connecting them with resources to support their ongoing wellbeing and stability in the community


